## From Rabbi Moch .....

#### The Changing World in 2015 Will Challenge Jews in Israel and Around the World

The Torah portion that corresponds to this change of the Gregorian year is the *Vayehi*. It records the deathbed scene of Jacob blessing

his two grandsons, Ephraim and Menashe. He crosses his hands to bless the younger with his right hand, reversing the way things have happened to make them the way he thinks they should be and repeating his own history of supplanting his older twin, Esau. Times are coming that will present a world farther from the one we know should and must be. We will have to find the understanding and where-with-all of Father Jacob to reverse the world we face in the coming year.

The second half of the twentieth Century, followed upon Hitler's "Final Solution to the Jewish Problem." Instead of an extinct Jewish People, we saw the rebirth of an independent Jewish State in the Land of Israel and the integration of Jews into general society all over the western world. Jews responded with a flourish of institution building within each Jewish community and connecting Jewish communities with each other and with the general world around us. At the turn of the millennium, Jews finally felt secure enough to turn their focus from strengthening Jewish life to heightening our spiritual life. We began to resurrect and learn from the rich storehouse of Jewish learning; we delved into Kabbalah, Mussar, Jewish philosophy, Talmud and Torah, as we had not done in several generations. Now, fifteen years into the twenty-first century, we stand poised for a spiritual renewal the likes of which we have not seen since the Golden Age of Spain.

The winds of change, however, portend a return to dark and difficult days that may once again challenge Jews' very right to live, whether in our resurrected land or at ease as Jews anywhere else in the world. What has changed that would question our continuing ability to live in a healthy and secure way in a world moving in the direction not only of tolerance but also of interconnectedness?

Change 1) We have enjoyed the benefits of a world dependent on strong and stable western powers, at the helm of which has been the United States and its NATO allies. Today, the United States seems barely able to govern itself internally; neither does it have a clear and strong foreign policy or the ability to take steps to insure world stability. In that Vacuum has emerged an emboldened Russia that seems intent on reclaiming some of is imperial past. A new balance will emerge and we do not yet know how that will affect world stability. Russia itself remains a place of deep and popular anti-Jewish sentiment. Russia's choices of backing the bloody regime of Bashir Al-Assad and trying to dismember Ukraine are

Page 4 not encouraging actions.

> Change 2) The Middle East and North Africa reel and teeter from the collapse of various regimes. Dictators have been deposed either by US intervention or by the deposition of dictators via the Arab Spring uprisings. From that chaos a frightful war has emerged in Syria. This war seems partly a civil war but partly a war pitting the US against Russia and Iran and all of them together against the new gorgon-like Islamic State of Iraq and Syria that has arisen from the chaos of those two countries. ISIS exercises its policies with a viciousness the likes of which we have not seen since the Second World War. ISIS poses a very real threat to the entire Middle East, including Israel, and to rest of the world as well. They have already made clear their intentions of waging a holy war of conquest across the world, like those of the early Muslim conquests of the 7th-12th Centuries. The most important battles will be fought over the imaginations of young Muslims the world over. Will their hearts be enticed by this spirit of adventurous world ascendancy or will their minds find folly in the malevolent practices of ISIS and their spirits come to reject the notion that God would want such murderous acts committed in the Divine Name.

> Change 3) Iran has emerged as a major military power with 77.5 million people and a very capable and wellequipped army, air force and navy that pose an existential threat to Israel. It produces its own drones, missiles, and could easily produce its own nuclear weapons in matter of a few short months after deciding the time is right for doing so. Iran has become a powerful counter force to US influence in the middle-east. It exerts its influence through its proxies: Hezbollah in Lebanon and the Houthi's in Yemen. They feed into a growing sectarian conflict between the Sunni and Shi'a sects of Islam. ISIS now emerges as the Sunni power that wants to out radicalize Iran, which champions Shi'a Islam. Iran has covertly attacked Jewish communities, like the bombing of the Jewish Community Center in Buenos Aires some years ago. ISIS will attack Jews without need of secrecy or pretext, as they have Christians and Yazidis within the areas they control.

> Change 4) There has been a spate of emerging and strengthening far right wing parties across Europe that bring back the old anti-Jewish charges of "Jewish world domination that must be reversed for European countries to once again prosper."

> Jewish life has become increasingly difficult in France, Hungary, Greece, Denmark, Sweden, Great Britain, Belgium and Austria. Extreme right-wing political movements swept to election victory this year like France's far-right National Front party, which was the outright winner in France with 26 percent support. Austria's farright Freedom Party advanced to take 20 percent of the vote. Greece's extreme right Golden Dawn party was third in the count with 9.4 percent. Golden Dawn, a former neo-Nazi organization whose leader and members are to face trial for criminal acts including murder, arson and extortion, will send three representatives to the European parliament. In Hungary, old scapegoats have come back to life in a nation that was flattened by globalization: foreigners, bankers, and Jews. Ironically, these right-wing parties gain their strength largely from anti-immigration sentiment, but they become strange bed-fellows with their own immigrant targets from Muslim lands when focusing on their anti-Jewish message. The Jews of Europe feel pressured and attacked from both groups.

> In France, worshipers in a synagogue were surrounded by a howling mob claiming to protest Israeli policy. In Brussels, four people were murdered in the Jewish museum, and a synagogue was firebombed. In London, a major supermarket said that it felt forced to remove kosher food from its shelves for fear that it would incite Continued on page 5.

a riot. A London theater refused to stage a Jewish film festival because the event had received a small grant from the Israeli embassy. The BBC's director of television, Danny Cohen, recently remarked, "I've never felt so uncomfortable being a Jew in the UK as I've felt in the last 12 months. And it's made me think about, you know, is it our long-term home, actually? Because you feel it. I've felt it in a way I've never felt before."

We in Canada have been very fortunate to have very good relations with our Muslim neighbours. We jointly engage in dialogue and cooperation to improve our community. The Aryan Brotherhood exists in the back-ground here but is not prominent nor actively attacking those they dislike. All that could change quickly were our economic system to go through rough times. The good news is that we have learned how to weather such times from much experience and have often thrived physically, spiritually and culturally under adverse conditions. More importantly, now, while we have much influence in North America, we must use it to build more bridges of understanding with our neighbours, including those who distrust and dislike us. May 2015 be a year in which we, like our ancestor Jacob, find ways to reverse the world as we see it and find new paths to a promised future of tranquility and beauty. May we do so with creativity, openness and determination.

#### **Rabbi Saperstein Confirmed as** Ambassador for International Religious Freedom

December 12, 2014, Washington, D.C. - In response to today's Senate vote to confirm Rabbi David Saperstein as Ambassador-at-Large for International Religious Freedom, Rabbi Rick Jacobs, President of the Union for Reform Judaism released the following statement:

"David's clear and powerful voice has been the voice of our Movement for 40 years. More than that, it has been the voice of the all-too-many among us who are often voiceless. Today the Senate has - wisely! - confirmed David's nomination to serve as U.S. Ambassador for International Religious Freedom. As he prepares to leave the Religious Action Center he has done so much to build, we know that the work of David's life will not change. He will continue to agitate for justice. He will continue to be a rodef shalom (a pursuer of peace). He will continue to defend the widow and the orphan and the stranger. David simply does not know another way.

There is no more lasting a legacy than what David has built: the Religious Action Center is a firmly established leader in Washington, D.C. pursuing justice, in our prophetic tradition, on a range of crucial public policies. It is the centerpiece of our Movement's commitment to tikkun olam, and our dedication to moral advocacy and activism. 
