**From Rabbi Louis .....**



**Both Sides Now**

Summertime and the living is *not* so Jewishly easy.

The nation of Israel is going through a rough time, both internally, and from external threats. There appears to be a rise in anti-Jewish sentiment world-wide that may correspond to worsening economic conditions. There have

been two incidents of Nazi symbolism graffiti in Victoria, which is very unusual.

Summer is when we recognize the *17<sup>th</sup> of Tammuz*, when the walls of Jerusalem were first breached 2500 years ago, and the *9<sup>th</sup> of Av*, when Jerusalem was destroyed — first by the Babylonians, and then by the Romans. In addition to the external threats at those times, the Jewish people were deeply divided among themselves, and this contributed to the problems. The sages say that the second Temple was destroyed because of senseless hatred between us.

However....

Summer is also the time for remembering our positive attributes, the way we come together to help each other. It is a time when we attempt to learn from our past mistakes. Summer is the time when we bask in the (unpredictable) warmth of the Victoria sun, and are able to relax. It is also the time when we received the revelation of the Ten Utterances and forgiveness for the sin of the Golden Calf.

Summer is the time when we renew our commitment to the State of Israel and to all of its citizens Moslem, Jewish, Christian and Druze. It is the time when we visit the Land and encourage non-racist attitudes among our brothers and sisters living there.

This year, especially, we greet with enthusiasm, the decision to recognize non-Orthodox Rabbis (including women Rabbis).

Each season has its ups and downs. May this summer be a time of reflection about the past and positive decisions of renewal for the future. The New Year will soon be upon us.

## President's Message

*Hello Temple Family,*



Where has the year gone? Here we are into July already with the summer solstice behind us. I'm hoping July and August bring us sun and warmth rather than the cool and wet we had throughout most of June.

Rabbi Louis' last service of the year was a lovely celebration that included the music of Gary and Amber from the group *Couscous*. The combination of Rabbi Louis' leadership and the musical abilities of *Couscous* made for a most enjoyable service that was both uplifting and fun. The Rabbi's service was well attended and there were a few new faces in the crowd. Throughout the year Rabbi Louis' services have been well attended and have attracted people from outside our congregation. Rabbi Louis has generously offered to lead a summer service on August 24. I'm pleased he will continue as our spiritual leader next year and will return for the High Holidays.

Our AGM is quickly approaching later this month. It will be held on July 17 at the Jewish Community Centre at 7:00 PM. I am extremely pleased with the success of the Nonviolent Communication (NVC) program. It began as a two day workshop last Fall, and continued with a 13 session practice group. Our NVC group created a close bond and there was a consensus to continue meeting so that we can improve the skills we have learned. The practice of NVC helps us to change our habitual patterns that have not served us well. It provides us tools for communicating from the heart, based on needs and feelings. All of us who participated in this training, found it very rewarding. Next fall we will offer another NVC workshop that will continue with a practice group. 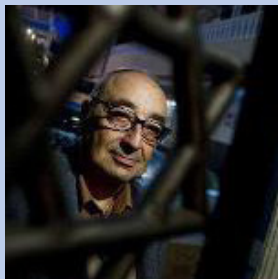

## **The Victoria and Vancouver Island Jewish Burial Society**

The Jewish Burial Society of Victoria and Vancouver Island is a service organization founded to assist all Jews with end of life requirements. We administer four totally separate and distinct sections in the Hatley Memorial Gardens and provide space for all persuasions of Jewish life from orthodox to secular, complete with cremation if specified.

The Society works with the Victoria Chevrah Kadisha in preparation of the body for burial, and works with the family in all ways to ensure that the concern and embrace of the entire community for the bereaved.

While we are a non profit Society, regrettably, end of life does not respect one's pocketbook, and costs are dear. There is a small membership charge that must be paid to become a member of our Society, and arrangements for this, and for burial requirements may be made at any time. We recommend dealing with one's self and saving the pain and expense of the survivors at a very stressful time.

The first stage of the beautification program is now complete. This consists of a network of paved pathways and a sign identifying the Jewish Community Section of the cemetery. In the very near future we hope to see a number of trees planted and a bench or benches placed. In the spring we hope to have a formal Service of Consecration at the cemetery, to which the whole of the Jewish community will be invited.
